Heifer International's mission is to end hunger and poverty while caring for the Earth. We facilitate community development, provide livestock, and train small-scale farmers in climate-smart agriculture and business skills. Through their hard work and commitment, our farmers translate Heifer's gifts into healthy incomes and growing economies. University researchers found that our model is effective at improving food security, reducing poverty and improving gender equality in the communities where we work. Livestock helps families become self-reliant.

OUR APPROACH

Our holistic approach helps communities become the drivers of their own change by cultivating the following:

Income and Nutrition

Increasing production and connecting farmers to markets brings higher incomes and healthier diets.

Improving the Environment

Climate-smart agriculture practices help farmers adapt to the effects of climate change while improving the environment and increasing yields.

Women's Empowerment

Our projects seek to increase women's participation in decisionmaking at the household and community levels, as well as their access to income and assets and leadership roles.

Social Capital

We put significant effort into helping groups form around common goals that benefit all. To foster self-reliance, we help communities self-direct their development and take advantage of inputs available from development organizations, government agencies and other sources.

Passing on the Gift®

The hallmark of our approach, each farming family passes on animals or time and knowledge. The act transforms recipients into donors and produces a profound sense of accomplishment. This practice, at a minimum, doubles the impact of the original gift. It's proof that small actions can lead to big results.

OUR IMPACT

Since 1944, we have helped more than 31 million families. We

monitor project data, track our progress and then evaluate our overall impact. These evaluations ensure that our work to place livestock and pass on knowledge and training in sustainable farming practices will benefit communities for generations.

OUR FUTURE

We have set a goal to help 4 million families achieve living incomes by 2020. This income will allow them to educate their children; feed themselves adequately every day; and have proper housing, water, hygiene and other essential resources. Along with defining living income benchmarks in the countries where we work, we are connecting farmers to markets to make sure they are able to sell what they produce and nurture local economies.



























